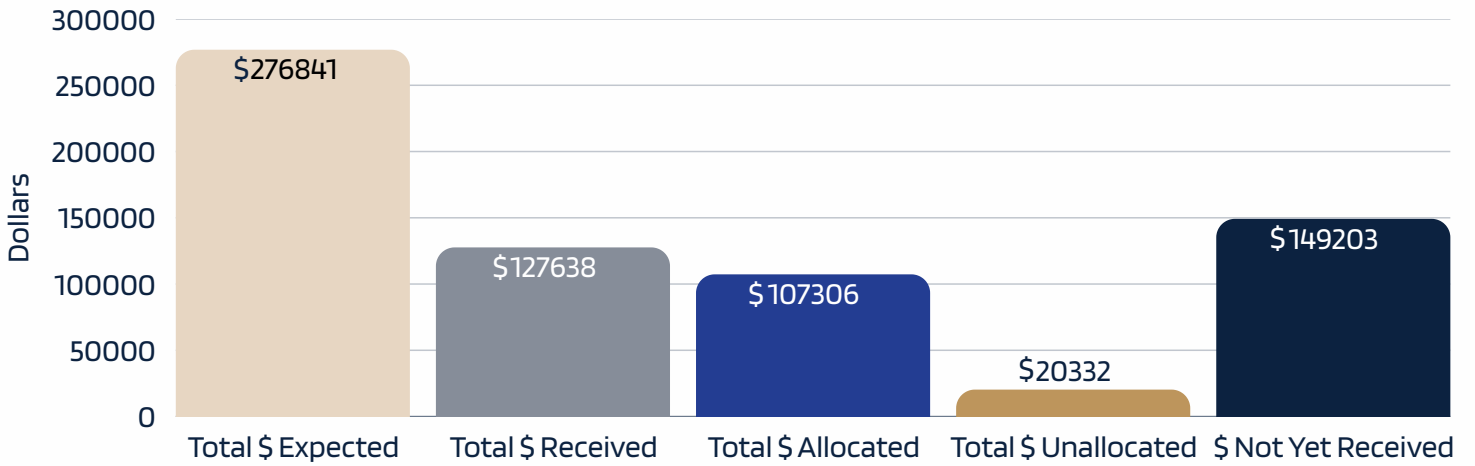
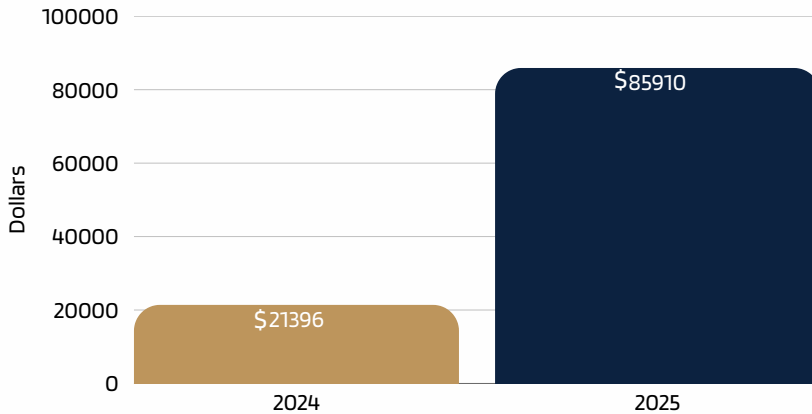


# Grant County Opioid Allocations Overview 2023-2025

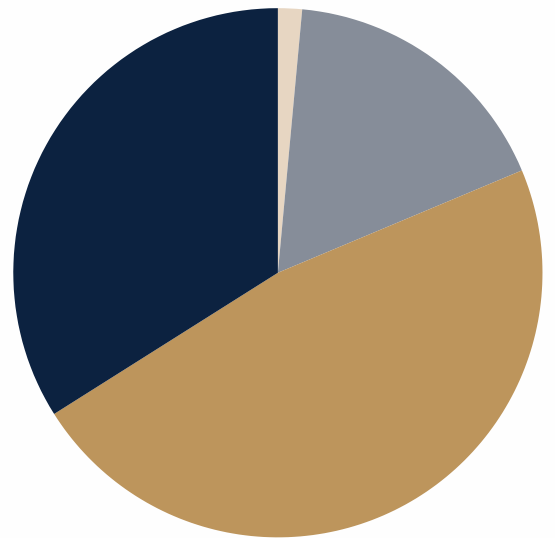


Allocations by Year

**Grant County Child & Youth Council**, Prevention & Early Intervention

**Title:** Youth Prevention Programming

**Funding Award:** \$8,100, **Start Project Period:** 2/6/2024

**Summary:** Youth evidence-based prevention programs in schools to prevent substance use and positive mental well-being.

**Horizon Public Health**, Prevention & Early Intervention, **Title:** Opioid Media Campaign

**Funding Award:** \$11,856, **Start Project Period:** 12/17/2024

**Summary:** A county-wide communications campaign using digital media, materials, and community events to prevent substance misuse, reduce stigma, delay initiation, and promote local prevention and treatment resources.

**Unity Recovery**, Treatment & Recovery, **Title:** Recovery Support Project

**Funding Award:** \$1,440, **Start Project Period:** 12/17/2024

**Summary:** A county-wide communications campaign using digital Assist rural residents without access to medical rides with gas cards to reduce transportation barriers for substance use disorder treatment and supporting individuals in recovery.

**Grant County Sheriff**, Prevention & Early Intervention, **Title:** Medication Drop Boxes

**Funding Award:** \$1,575, **Start Project Period:** 9/2/2025

**Summary:** Expanding drug take-back disposal programs with secure public drop boxes in Grant County and increasing community education on safe medication disposal through social media outreach.

**Grant County Sheriff**, Harm Reduction, **Title:** DARE Programming

**Funding Award:** \$11,915, **Start Project Period:** 9/2/2025

**Summary:** D.A.R.E. is an evidence-based, school- and community-based prevention program that partners law enforcement and educators to teach K-12 students resilience skills and strategies to resist substance misuse, violence, and gangs.

**Herman-Norcross School**, Prevention & Early Intervention, **Title:** Youth Community Improvements

**Funding Award:** \$11,000, **Start Project Period:** 9/2/2025

**Summary:** This project will update the Herman-Norcross tennis courts for multiple sports and add a GaGa Ball court, creating improved recreational spaces for students, families, and the community.

**Vivie**, Prevention & Early Intervention, **Title:** PEARLS Program

**Funding Award:** \$7,950, **Start Project Period:** 9/2/2025

**Summary:** PEARLS is an evidence-based, community-delivered program that equips older adults with tools to manage depression and build healthier lives while expanding access to mental health care in underserved and rural communities through trained coaches, interns, and bilingual support.

**West Central MN Communities Action**, Treatment & Recovery, **Title:** Rental Assistance & Outreach

**Funding Award:** \$35,000. **Start Project Period:** 9/2/2025

**Summary:** A comprehensive, trauma-informed approach to support people in treatment and recovery, prevents opioid misuse, and reduces overdose deaths by combining housing navigation, case management, harm reduction, community partnerships, and culturally relevant outreach.

**Grant County Sheriff**, Law Enforcement & Criminal Justice, **Title:** Wellness Program

**Funding Award:** \$7,820, **Start Project Period:** 9/16/2025

**Summary:** A comprehensive Wellness Program Policy including a coordinator, stress debriefings, wellness checks, and potential physical fitness initiatives to reduce trauma impacts, combat suicide risk, and strengthen the health and resilience of law enforcement staff..

**Grant County Sheriff**, Law Enforcement & Criminal Justice, **Title:** Fitness Program

**Funding Award:** \$10,650, **Start Project Period:** 9/16/2025

**Summary:** The Grant County Sheriff's Office will implement a comprehensive Wellness Program that supports physical and mental health through fitness memberships, tailored training, and clinical consultation, fostering a healthier, more resilient law enforcement workforce.
