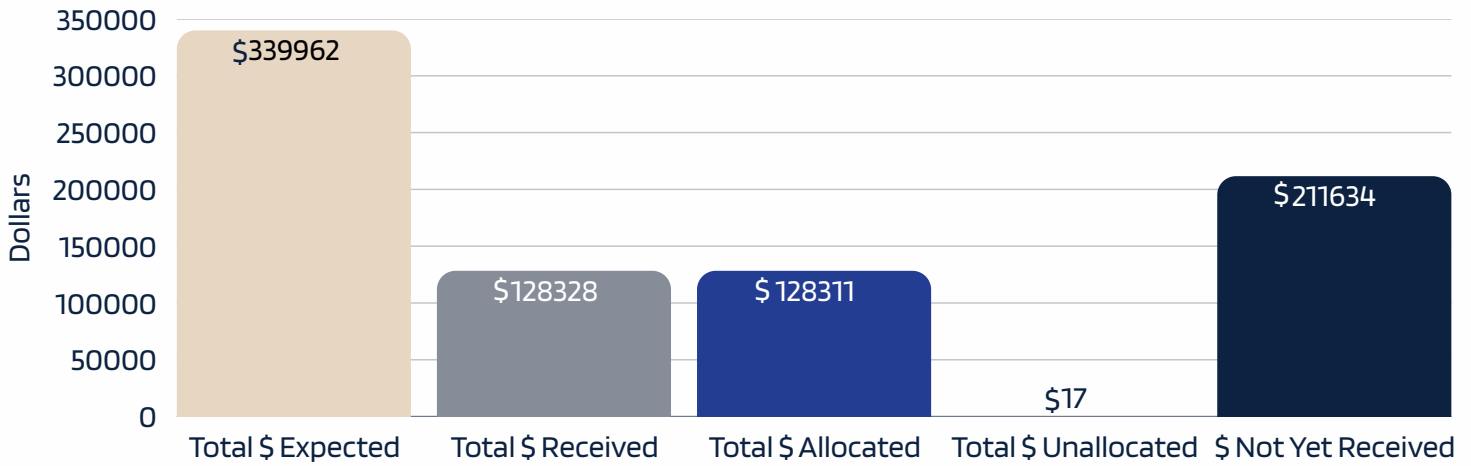
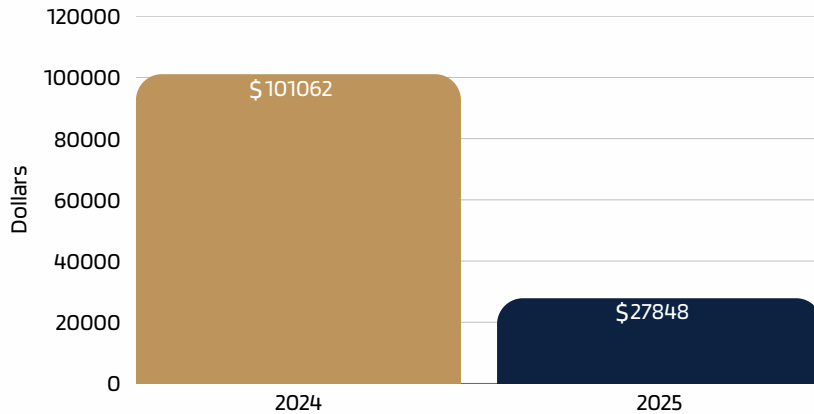


Traverse County Opioid Allocations Overview 2023-2025

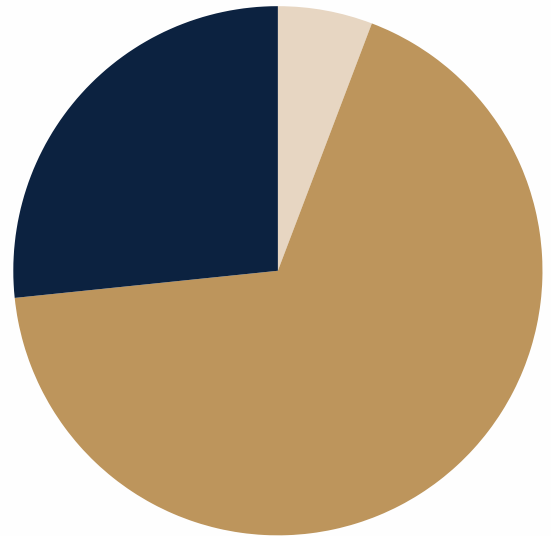


Allocations by Year

Browns Valley School, Prevention & Early Intervention

Title: Tutoring and Social Emotional Learning

Funding Award: \$20,000, **Start Project Period:** 3/14/2024

Summary: Support youth-focused substance use prevention programming and social emotional learning.

Browns Valley School, Prevention & Early Intervention, Title: Empower U Curriculum

Funding Award: \$17,290, **Start Project Period:** 7/12/2024

Summary: Classroom resilience lessons and evidence-based SEL programs that build student coping skills, resilience, and healthy decision-making to reduce risks of substance misuse.

Traverse County 4H, Prevention & Early Intervention, Title: 4-H Opioid Prevention and Education Initiative

Funding Award: \$6,546, **Start Project Period:** 7/12/2024

Summary: Engage youth and families in prevention education, outreach, and supportive programming to reduce opioid misuse and strengthen community resilience.

Traverse County Jail, Prevention & Early Intervention, **Title:** Inmate Safety & Opioid Response Project

Funding Award: \$12,800, **Start Project Period:** 7/12/2024

Summary: The Traverse County Jail project will enhance inmate safety and opioid response by partnering with treatment providers, expanding access to MOUD, and installing advanced monitoring systems to prevent overdoses and related health crises.

Wheaton School, Prevention & Early Intervention, **Title:** Responsive Classroom Training Initiative

Funding Award: \$4,000, **Start Project Period:** 7/12/2024

Summary: Responsive Classroom training for teachers and paraprofessionals to build social-emotional skills, strengthen community, and support student well-being as part of opioid misuse prevention efforts.

Horizon Public Health, Prevention & Early Intervention, **Title:** Opioid Media Campaign

Funding Award: \$11,856, **Start Project Period:** 12/17/2024

Summary: A county-wide communications campaign using digital media, materials, and community events to prevent substance misuse, reduce stigma, delay initiation, and promote local prevention and treatment resources.

Beyond Brink, Treatment & Recovery, **Title:** Peer Recovery Support

Funding Award: \$28,570. **Start Project Period:** 12/17/2024

Summary: Provide immediate peer recovery support, resource navigation, education, outreach, and a support line, while tracking impact through data on recovery connections, Narcan training, and OUD/SUD/MOUD evaluations.

Wheaton School, Harm Reduction, **Title:** AED & Naloxone Access

Funding Award: \$6,200, **Start Project Period:** 7/15/2025

Summary: Updating AEDs with NARCAN, including permanent units in schools and portable units for extracurricular activities, to ensure life-saving response capacity for cardiac arrest or opioid overdose both on-site and during travel.

Browns Valley School, Prevention & Early Intervention, **Title:** Empower U Curriculum

Funding Award: \$10,348, **Start Project Period:** 7/15/2025

Summary: Classroom resilience lessons and evidence-based SEL programs that build student coping skills, resilience, and healthy decision-making to reduce risks of substance misuse.

City of Browns Valley, Prevention & Early Intervention, **Title:** Youth Prevention Programming

Funding Award: \$9,800, **Start Project Period:** 7/15/2025

Summary: Creating a dedicated youth space in the Browns Valley public library to promote mental health, prevent substance misuse, and foster collaboration across government, education, and community partners.

Wheaton School, Prevention & Early Intervention, **Title:** Stop-It Resources

Funding Award: \$1,500, **Start Project Period:** 7/15/2025

Summary: An anonymous reporting program that enables students, parents, and community members to share safety concerns, providing 24/7 monitoring and rapid response by school administrators or law enforcement to help protect students.
