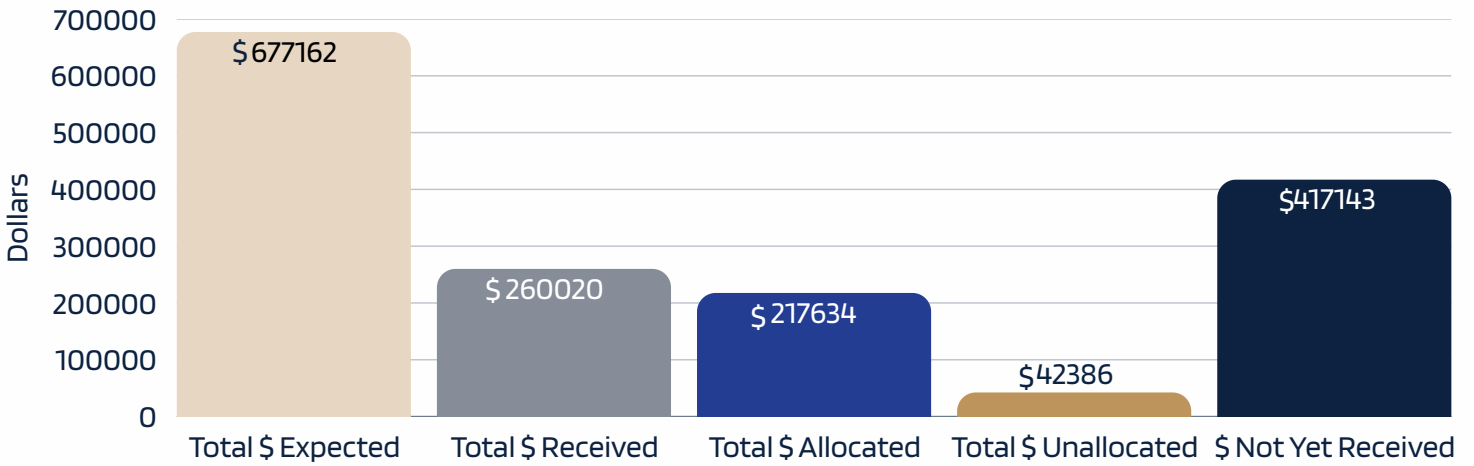
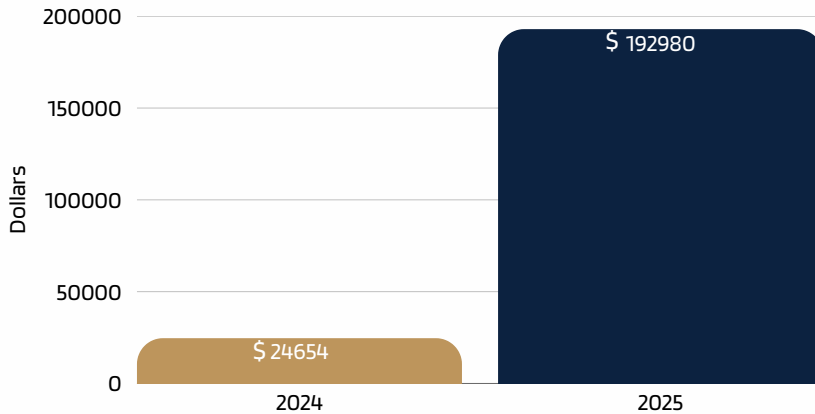


Pope County Opioid Allocations Overview 2023-2025

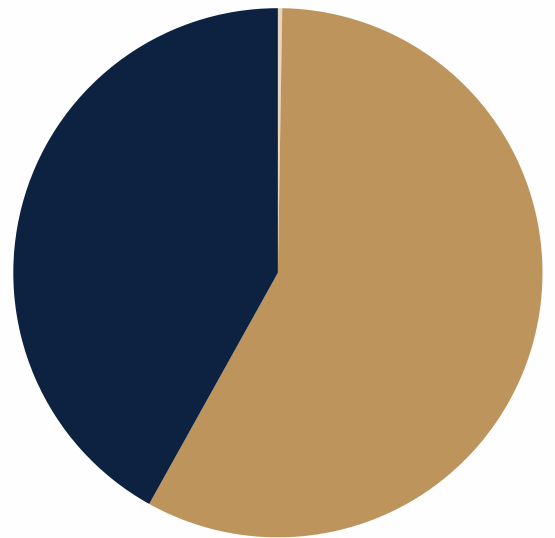


Allocations by Year

Project Details

Pope County Sheriff, Harm Reduction

Title: Naloxone

Funding Award: \$574, **Start Project Period:** 2/3/2024

Summary: Supply and train officers in the use of Naloxone, ensuring they are equipped to respond quickly to opioid overdoses, save lives in the field, and connect individuals to appropriate treatment and recovery resources.

Pope County Sheriff, Prevention & Early Intervention, Title: DARE Programming

Funding Award: \$4,000, **Start Project Period:** 2/3/2024

Summary: D.A.R.E. is an evidence-based, school- and community-based prevention program that partners law enforcement and educators to teach K-12 students resilience skills and strategies to resist substance misuse, violence, and gangs.

Unity Recovery, Treatment & Recovery, Title: Unity Recovery Support Project

Funding Award: \$1,224, **Start Project Period:** 2/3/2024

Summary: Unity Recovery will provide gas cards to rural residents without access to medical rides, reducing transportation barriers to substance use disorder treatment and supporting individuals in recovery.

Minnewaska Public School, Prevention & Early Intervention, **Title:** Be Kind Programming

Funding Award: \$7,000, **Start Project Period:** 10/25/2024

Summary: The Be Kind project seeks to prevent opioid misuse and reduce stigma by engaging youth, families, and communities in positive experiences, education, and supportive programming.

Horizon Public Health, Prevention & Early Intervention, **Title:** Opioid Media Campaign

Funding Award: \$11,856, **Start Project Period:** 12/17/2024

Summary: A county-wide communications campaign using digital media, materials, and community events to prevent substance misuse, reduce stigma, delay initiation, and promote local prevention and treatment resources.

Pope County Sheriff, Prevention & Early Intervention, **Title:** DARE Programming

Funding Award: \$5,000. **Start Project Period:** 12/17/2024

Summary: D.A.R.E. is an evidence-based, school- and community-based prevention program that partners law enforcement and educators to teach K-12 students resilience skills and strategies to resist substance misuse, violence, and gangs.

Vivie, Prevention & Early Intervention, **Title:** PEARLS Programming

Funding Award: \$7,980, **Start Project Period:** 8/5/2025

Summary: PEARLS is an evidence-based, community-delivered program that equips older adults with tools to manage depression and build healthier lives while expanding access to mental health care in underserved and rural communities through trained coaches, interns, and bilingual support.

Car Care, Treatment & Recovery, **Title:** Transportation for Opioid Affected Individuals

Funding Award: \$10,348, **Start Project Period:** 7/15/2025

Summary: Classroom resilience lessons and evidence-based SEL programs that build student coping skills, resilience, and healthy decision-making to reduce risks of substance misuse.

West Central MN Community Action, Treatment & Recovery, **Title:** Rental Assistance & Outreach

Funding Award: \$35,000, **Start Project Period:** 9/2/2025

Summary: A comprehensive, trauma-informed approach to support people in treatment and recovery, preventing opioid misuse, & reducing overdose deaths by combining housing navigation, case management, harm reduction, community partnerships, and culturally relevant outreach.

Minnewaska Area School, Prevention & Early Intervention, **Title:** Minnewaska Area Schools Opioid and Substance Use Prevention Initiative

Funding Award: \$90,000, **Start Project Period:** 9/2/2025

Summary: Minnewaska Area Schools, in partnership with community organizations, will implement evidence-based prevention curriculum, staff training, student-led initiatives, family engagement events, and a county-wide data dashboard to reduce opioid misuse and strengthen student and community wellness.
